

Hacker Golf – Games People Play

Hacker Teams will determine the weekly game by rotating the choice by team number through all the teams. Unless noted, all results are based on net scores.

For opening day, the Grand PooBah has chosen – Foursome – Step Aside Scramble. One drive per player, best ball on each shot steps aside, all players putt. Lowest net score per hole.

Here are some suggestions based on previous seasons, or you may pick your own favorite game.

- Individual – Low net score for Men and low net score for Women - two separate games
- Foursome - Two best net scores of four
- Foursome – Total Net (total of 4 net scores)
- Foursome - One Best Ball on Odd Holes and Two Best Balls on Even Holes
- Foursome - Combined net scores (men on odd holes, women on even holes)
- Foursome – TBBNG – two best balls net and gross per foursome*
- Battle of the Sexes -Combined Net of Women Against Combined Net of Men
- Foursome - 1 Best Ball on Par 5s ; 2 Best Balls on Par 4s ; 3 Best Balls on Par 3s
- Foursome - Combined Net Scores of Guys on Odd Holes, Women on Even Holes
- Foursome – Step Aside Scramble (Used for the Hacker opening day)
- Foursome of twosome – Stableford total points (1pt boggie, 2pts par, 3 pts birdie, 4pt better)
- Twosome - Alternate Shot – Net score
- Twosome – 3 Clubs & putter – combined net score
- Twosome – Approach Golf – required special set up be pro shop
- Twosome - Total Net of twosome (Used for the Hacker Cup)
- Twosome – Chapman **

*TBBNG – two best balls net and gross per foursome – scoring per hole: One gross and one net best ball. 2 different scores must be used (can't use the same player for both gross and net scores). Must use the lowest gross score per hole (even if their net would be the lowest). For low gross score ties on a hole, team may pick which score to use.

** Chapman – Both players hit drives. Each plays the others ball for the second shot. Select the best second shot and play alternate shot into the hole. Chapman handicaps are determined by adding both handicaps and taking 50%. (Ex: 12 hcp and a 24 hcp = 36 total x 50% = 18 chapman handicap)
